There's more to Jeremy Greenberg than meets the eye. With a Master of Fine Arts from Rutgers University, Greenberg is capitalizing on his talent as an actor with a regular role on the Lifetime network drama, "Army Wives," as well as roles on "Brothers and Sisters," "Law and Order," "The Kill Point," "The Practice," "White Collar" and many more primetime television shows. His film credits include "Salt," "Deprivation," "Skeletons in the Closet" and "Windtalkers." Theater performances include "Epic Proportions" on Broadway, "Nijinsky's Last Dance," for which he received a Helen Hayes Nomination for Best Actor and numerous other off-Broadway productions.

However, he is putting his creative writing background to use as well, earning a jury award for Best Film at the Stonybrook Film Festival for "Tickling Leo," a feature film that he wrote and directed.

Between tapings, Greenberg, who uses the name "Jeremy Davidson" professionally, supports community organizations such as New York Cares, Operation Homefront, Friedreich's Ataxia Research Alliance and the Medical University of South Carolina Children's Hospital.
