Reports

Board President Michon Stuart reported:

Liaisons- Tioga Hills is busy fundraising for 5<sup>th</sup> grade end-of-year activities. Vestal Hills is fundraising for a new laminating machine. Glenwood's Science Fair had great participation. Parents benefited from the Math Matters workshop. High school and BU students helped out at the Clayton Avenue Science Fair.  
--the Audit Committee reviewed the proposals for external audit services

--of the 16 teams that participated in the Odyssey of the Mind last weekend, 3 will be going on to State competition.

--the Student Government workshop held at Vestal Middle School was a great collaborative effort, 13 local schools participated

Interim Superintendent Jeffrey Ahearn reported:

--InfoTech will be reintroduced to grade 6 to help with keyboarding and basic document computer skills; Foreign Language will be a full year for grades 7 and 8 instead of every other day

--State Education Department has approved a waiver for Lorraine Paushter – information will be posted on the website, as required.

--the workshop Math Matters was attended by over 60 parents

--preliminary 2016-17 budget figures indicate a negative levy increase (-0.45%) and an estimated budget gap of approximately \$35,843; final state aid amounts will help finalize the budget and it will be balanced.

--the 2016-17 student attendance calendar for BOCES was reviewed, we are finalizing our student calendar

Attorney Frank Miller was introduced and he was asked to speak on the Hall of Fame issue regarding concerns presented to the board on the inclusion of Stacey Campfield, Vestal alumni, in the school district Hall of Fame. Mr. Campfield was inducted into the Vestal Hall of Fame in 2008 and since that time has made public comments that others have deemed offensive. A few members of the VHS staff and a student group have expressed to the Board an interest in having Mr. Campfield removed from the HOF because of these comments.

Mr. Miller began by explaining his qualifications and experience in the field of constitutional law and education law. Mr. Miller explained that he has represented school districts for 37 years and has been primary attorney in over 250 reported court decisions representing school districts and municipalities. He also explained that he had the privilege of arguing a case before the United States Supreme Court in 2001. The case was a first amendment civil rights and viewpoint discrimination case entitled, GOODNEWS CLUB V. MILFORD CSD. The Case involved issues of “viewpoint discrimination” which he explained are the very issues involved in the “Hall of Fame” discussion. He shared information on civil rights and the constitutional Amendments. He explained some basic differences between public and private institutions, and how the laws differed between them. Public school districts are a regulated government agency, and as a result are held to tighter and more restrictive standards.

Mr. Miller reminded the board members that each of them were required to take an oath of office to uphold the Constitution. In such, the First Amendment guarantees a person the right of free speech or expression (even if one individual’s expression is deemed offensive to another individual). As a result, board members are bound to uphold the laws and freedoms of the country. Willingly violating their duties may subject them to penalties that may include removal from their board position and personal liabilities. Such action would also expose the District to considerable financial liability as well.

As for the Hall of Fame, the District has created a “*limited open forum*” with its process of induction to the Hall of Fame, based on the minimum criteria to qualify. Frank shared two law cases that closely parallel or relate to the district’s situation with Stacey Campfield. The cases referenced: Kiesinger v. Mexico Academy & Central School and Good News Club v. Milford Central School. The Hall of Fame constitutes a “limited open forum” in which the “government allows limited types of expression.” Good News Club v. Milford CSD is an example of a district setting up a limited open forum and then wrongfully excluding a group from participation because it did not agree with its viewpoint. In a limited open forum you cannot exclude a group or viewpoint solely because “you do not like the message.” A “limited open forum applies to nominees as well, especially where the District seeks to remove a person previously selected, but proposed for removal, because of post selection speech which the District found objectionable. Freedom of speech is protected because the First Amendment regulates government action, not private conduct or speech.”

In response to the requests to remove Stacey Campfield from the Hall of Fame, Mr. Miller cautioned the Board that it would be difficult to remove someone, especially based on their

expressed views that could violate a basic right of expression. To exclude Campfield would mean “we are taking action based solely on his view point – *viewpoint discrimination*. You cannot discriminate to remove discrimination. The cure for offensive speech is more speech.”

The situation is further complicated by the fact that the Hall of Fame does not have an established formal committee procedure on removal. A question was asked about taking down the entire Hall of Fame and starting over. Mr. Miller stated that the forum can be closed down but “procedures cannot be based on viewpoint. The First amendment was written to protect speech we don’t like. The Board cannot single out one individual on the basis of his expression – this would be *viewpoint discrimination*.”

Mr. Miller addressed a teacher question, “What about DASA (Dignity for All Students Act)?” Mr. Miller went on to explain that “DASA regulates conduct and speech in the presence of the individual. The picture of Mr. Campfield doesn’t do anything nor does it contain an expression of his viewpoint. There is no conflict between the protections of DASA and the Campfield picture.” He also stated that DASA does not apply to speech outside of our hearing, especially speech outside the state.” Further, there has been “no in-person contact by Stacey Campfield with any student or staff member where DASA would apply.”

Mr. Miller responded to the parent question, “What’s the school’s responsibility to help kids get by that picture?” He replied, “They are always going to confront ignorance and bigotry. The first amendment assures us that we will always be exposed to things we don’t want to see or hear. By taking the picture down, such action would constitute “retribution for the expression of his opinion and this can result in– discrimination on the basis of his expression.”

What was recommended was to use this as a teaching moment for the students as Vestal’s own case of protection of rights and the importance of tolerance bearing even for opinions we don’t like or agree with. Teaching tolerance for what others believe and say would help students.

Several members of the audience, including students were able to question Mr. Miller on various legal aspects. The Board decided to have an executive session to review some options.
