The Board meeting was called to order at 6:00 pm by Board of Education President Dinno Nistico in the Board Conference Room of the Administration Building. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Student Government President Samson Wong reported on the following: Samson reported that high school clubs are meeting prior to the school year starting in order to set goals and tentative dates/deadlines for activities. They also hope to form a Club Council in an effort to coordinate club activities. Upperclassmen are once again volunteering to be Student Mentors to the incoming freshman. Mentor training will be taking place on 8/23, as well as 8/31 prior to Freshman Orientation.

On motion by Mark Browning, second by Shoba Agneshwar, the Board voted 7 to 0 to adjourn immediately into Executive Session to discuss the recommendations from the Committee on Preschool Special Education and the Committee on Special Education, as well as to receive updates on negotiations with AVSP and VEA, as well as two personnel matters.

On motion by Linda Daino, second by Eric LaClair, the Board voted 8 to 0 to approve the minutes of the Reorganization Meeting of July 12, 2022 as written.

## Board President Dinno Nistico reported on the following:

--Laura Weisse reported as liaison of the Text Selection Committee. The committee includes administrators, teachers, librarians, and a Board member. The first meeting was held on July 20th, at which time district textbook adoption guidelines for fiction and non-fiction books were reviewed. They also discussed library vs. classroom books. Some new textbooks were reviewed and the committee agreed to bring them forward to the Board for approval in August in order to pilot them during the 2022-23 school year.

- --Dinno indicated that there were still openings for Board liaisons on the Wellness Policy Advisory Committee, as well as the District Planning Group. A brief description of these two committees was given, and the Superintendent agreed to provide a full description of each committee going forward so Board members would have a clearer idea of the purpose. Kathryn Egan agreed to be the Board liaison on the Wellness Policy Advisory Committee, and Linda Daino volunteered to be the Board liaison for the District Planning Group.
- --Dinno, Linda, and Michael Sherwood attended the NYSSBA Summer Law Conference in Albany on 7/21/22. Topics included teacher shortages, FOIL requests, and collective bargaining.
- --NYSSBA Annual Convention 10/27-10/29 in Syracuse. Registration opens on 8/1. Dinno encouraged Board members to participate and to contact the District Clerk regarding registration.
