
We are looking forward to seeing our ARE families on Thursday, May 11th for our Open House.

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Elementary Student Placement for 2023-24

I very much appreciate your awareness of and cooperation with the Vestal Central School District's practices regarding parent requests for student placement for the 2023-2024 school year.

The establishment of classroom rosters is a complex process. It involves professional dialogue between African Road staff on a wide variety of factors including achievement data collected over the course of the previous year (s). These factors include, but are not limited to (in no particular order), the:

•balancing of gender in any one classroom.

- •balancing of students' abilities and needs across multiple developmental, social and academic areas.
- •design of student groupings to maximize effective instructional practices being implemented by staff (balanced literacy, cooperative learning, technology integration, assessment structures, etc.).
- •design of student groupings to maximize the use of support staff including academic intervention service providers, special education providers and paraprofessionals.

Given these considerations, we are unable to accept parent requests for a specific teacher. It is the principal's responsibility to finalize all classroom rosters. If there are extenuating circumstances that would be necessary to know in placing your child, please submit this information in writing to me by **May 25, 2023**. Written information will be reviewed and shared with relevant staff members during the placement process.

Classroom assignments will be mailed home in mid-August. Please understand that factors such as an enrollment shift in the summer or staff changes could result in a change in your child's class assignment prior to the opening of school.

Please accept my sincere thanks for all your feedback and support this year. I'm honored to be a part of the tradition of excellence here in Vestal, and I am looking forward to the start of another great school year.

COUNSELING CORNER



CLASSROOM LESSONS:

For K-2: Second Step lessons are still being taught weekly in all these classrooms. We are now finishing up Unit 4 which is Problem Solving! We have moved right along this year and the last unit will take us up until sometime in May, where I will be talking about Mental Health!

ALL GRADES: At the end of April, and beginning of May, I am in the classrooms teaching about personal safety and abuse prevention skills. The lessons are developmentally appropriate per grade level and the topics include stranger-danger, how to say "no", and how to keep their body safe. These lessons will take place in one 45-minute lesson. As school counselors, we are mandated by New York State Commissioner's Regulations to provide this instruction as per Erin's Law. Students will rotate through different stations where they will learn about different ways to help improve their mental health! It's a great way to learn that our mental health is just as important, if not more, than our physical health! Plenty of fun activities planned such as yoga and a nature walk!

I can't believe we are already talking about the end of the year! It's time to prepare them for their next big adventure: the middle school! Coming up in May and June, I will be doing lunch bunches with 5th graders about what a middle school day looks like, learning how to read a schedule, what they looking forward to most and doing a middle school tour. I will also be introducing locks, and how to unlock their lockers! Lockers are a big deal for incoming 6th graders! If you have one laying around let them practice! Lots of exciting things coming our 5th graders' way!

Here are some facts about Earth Day:

1. Around 27,000 trees are cut down each day

The world has over 3.04 trillion trees in the world. However, 27,000 of them are cut down daily to make toilet paper. This translates to about 9.8 million trees annually. One single recycled edition of the New York Times newspaper could save 75,000 tree

2. Humans use only 1% of all available water

About 71% of the earth is water. The oceans hold approximately 96.5% of this water and the ice caps hold about 2%. The remaining water exists in rivers, ponds, glaciers, ice caps, lakes, as water vapor and our taps, among other water bodies. Only 1% of the earth's water is safe for human consumption.

3. 78% of marine mammals are at risk of choking on plastic

Seventy-eight percent of marine mammals are at risk of accidental deaths, such as getting caught in fishing nets. Plastic bags and other plastic garbage that ends up in the ocean kill over 1,000,000 sea animals every year.


