He attended Lafayette College where he majored in chemistry. In 1965, he completed medical school at New Jersey Medical School; he completed a rotating internship at the Tripler Army Medical Center in Honolulu, Hawaii; did his internal medicine residency at Fitzsimons Army Medical Center in Denver, and his fellowship in cardiology at the Letterman Army Medical Center in San Francisco. He served in the U.S. Army where he was a Lt. Colonel, Cardiologist in the U.S. Army Medical Corps; a Lt. Colonel, Cardiologist, U.S. Army Reserves; Colonel, U.S. Army Reserves; Commander, 352nd Evacuation Hospital, U.S. Army Reserves, and Colonel, U.S. Army Reserves, retired.

His private practice experience began in 1971 when he was Chief of the Cardiac Catheterization Laboratory at the Walter Reed Army Medical Center in Washington D.C. Other positions include Professor of Medicine, University of Illinois at Chicago; Chief, Cardiology Section, University of Illinois at Chicago; Scientific Director, St. John's Cardiovascular Research Center; Professor of Medicine and Radiological Sciences, UCLA School of Medicine, and Chief, Division of Cardiology, Department of Medicine, Harbor-UCLA Medical Center.

Bruce is considered by many in his field to be one of the top cardiologists in the world. Presently, he is the Medical Director, Heart Institute of the Cascades, Bend, Oregon; Medical Director of Heart Services, St. Charles Medical Center, Bend, Oregon; Consulting Cardiologist, Bend Memorial Clinic, and emeritus. Professor of Medicine, UCLA School of Medicine. Throughout his distinguished career, Bruce has received over \$7 million in research grants and fellowships.
