

# **Christopher Coleman**

**Class of 1985**

Chris earned a B.A. in economics and philosophy and received his M.B.A. from Binghamton University. While at Vestal he was a track standout. Since 1985 he has held the Section IV record for the 100-meter dash with a time of 10.6 seconds. He was inducted into Binghamton University's Hall of Fame for track and as an undergraduate he was a track and field resident assistant while he simultaneously trained as a member of the United States Olympic Bobsled Team. As a graduate student, he was the recipient of the Clifford Clark Fellowship and continued his training as a member of the U.S. Bobsled Team. He was also a member of the distinguished Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity.

As a member of the U.S. Bobsled Team, Chris was the brakeman for both the 1992 and 1994 U.S. Winter Olympic Teams. In 1992, the team placed 9th in the games held in Albertville, France. In 1994, the team placed 14th at Lillehammer, Norway. He has also served on the United States Bobsled and Skeleton Federation Board of Directors as an athlete representative. Chris works for the United States Olympic Committee in Colorado.
