OMNI for Retirees

Information & Reminders from Personnel

If you are retiring, will be returning as a substitute, and currently participate in an OMNI 403b deduction, your OMNI account will need attention upon your retirement. You may continue your 403b deduction, OR you may stop your 403b deduction.

In order to stop your deduction, you will need to complete a Salary Reduction Agreement, listing your service provider in Part 3 with a contribution amount of \$0.00. This can be done online at www.omni403b.com, or you may obtain a paper form from the Personnel Office.

Again, this only affects retirees who plan to return as substitutes.
