He is also the chairman of the department of orthopedic surgery for United Health Services (UIHS), and the team physician for Binghamton University. He is an active staff member for both UHS and Lourdes Hospitals. He is currently a member of the Board of Directors for Professional Home Care, Inc. He has also been a board member of the Independent Practice Association of the Southern Tier, Inc., and was the medical director of the Binghamton Office of Liberty Mutual Insurance. He is a member of the American Medical Association, the Eastern Orthopedic Association, the Broome County Medical Society and the Medical Society of the State of New York. He is the inventor of an Arthroscopic Measuring Device used to aid in the performance of arthroscopic acromioplasty, which is manufactured by Acufex.
