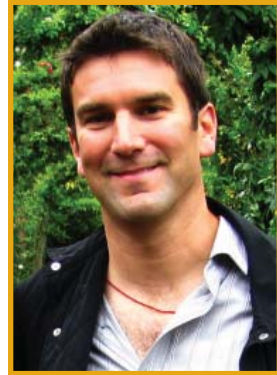


2012 Hall of Fame Honoree

Eric Remza

A high-altitude mountaineering guide for the last 15 years, Eric Remza has guided and climbed extensively throughout the great mountain ranges of the world, including six of the Seven Summits. They are the highest mountain peaks of each of the seven major continents and include Aconcagua in South America, Denali in North America, Mount Vinson in Antarctica, Kilimanjaro in Africa, Carstensz Pyramid on the Oceanic/Australian continent, Mount Everest in Asia and Mount Elbrus in Europe. (Note, Mount Elbrus is on his bucket list for Summer 2012.)

Inspired by a passion for the environment and a love of world cultures, Mr. Remza has led expeditions to Nepal, Tibet, Papua, Antarctica and, of course, Mount Everest. He has made 12 ascents of Aconcagua, the highest peak in the Andes Mountains of South America and eight ascents of Denali.

With degrees from Prescott College in Environmental Studies and Wilderness Leadership, Mr. Remza currently guides for International Mountain Guides in Washington State.

Eric Remza splits his time between his two residences in Seattle, Washington, and Crested Butte, Colorado, enjoying the diversity of living near the ocean and in the mountains. Naturally, he craves the outdoors and loves activities such as rock climbing and skiing.
