Dr. Jamie (Laubisch) Flerlage **Class of 2001**

Even as a Pediatric Chief Resident at the renowned Johns Hopkins Medical Center, Dr. Jamie Flerlage also finds time to make medical mission trips to Peru and Uganda, teach medical school in Malaysia, run a weekly international working group on pediatric palliative care, coach youth hockey and co-author the 20th edition of the



Harriet Lane Handbook of Pediatric Medicine. She recently began a fellowship at St. Jude's Research Center in the department of pediatric oncology and spent six months at their partner site in Guatemala City to begin a fellowship program to train nurses in palliative care.

From 2002 when she received the Young Women's Promise Award to this year's Johns Hopkins' Kamsler Award for outstanding compassion in the care of pediatric patients, Dr. Flerlage has amassed numerous athletic, academic and career awards. She has been named Outstanding Junior Female Athlete of the Year (Union College, 2004); Union College Presidential Scholarship (2001 - 2005); Compassion in Action Community Service Award (Arbor Hill, NY, 2008); Gold Humanism Honor Society (Albany Medical College, 2009); Dr. Bernard F. Brophy Alumni Memorial Scholarship (2009); Mary Pat Dearing MD Memorial Oncology Award (2009); Pediatric Faculty Prize (Albany Medical College, 2009); and Johns Hopkins' Adolescent Hero Award (2012). Most recently she was inducted into the Johns Hopkins Chapter of the Alpha Omega Alpha (AOA) Honor Society.
