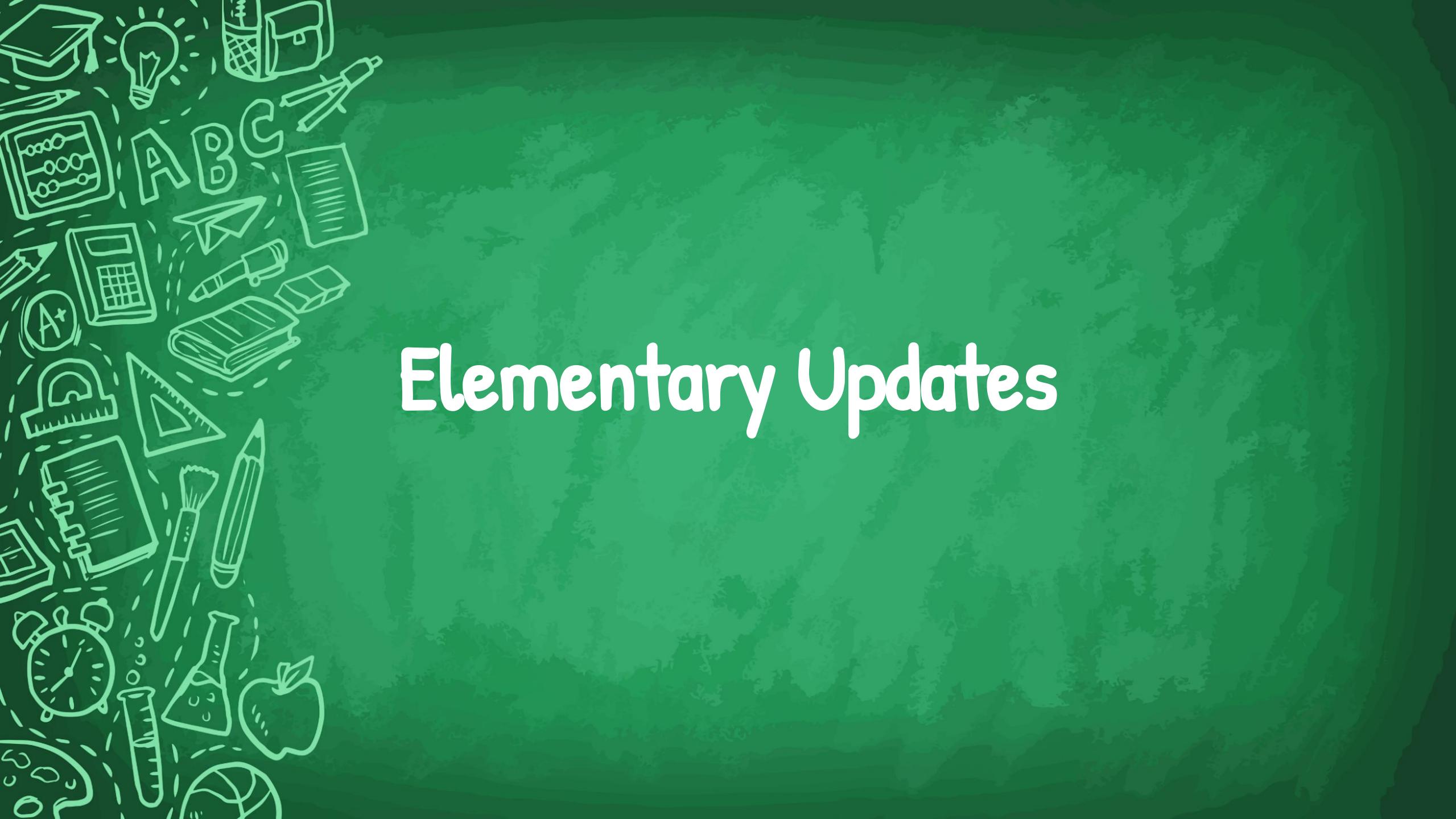


Instructional Updates Related to the Four-Day Transition



Timeline: Transition to 4 Days of In-Person Learning

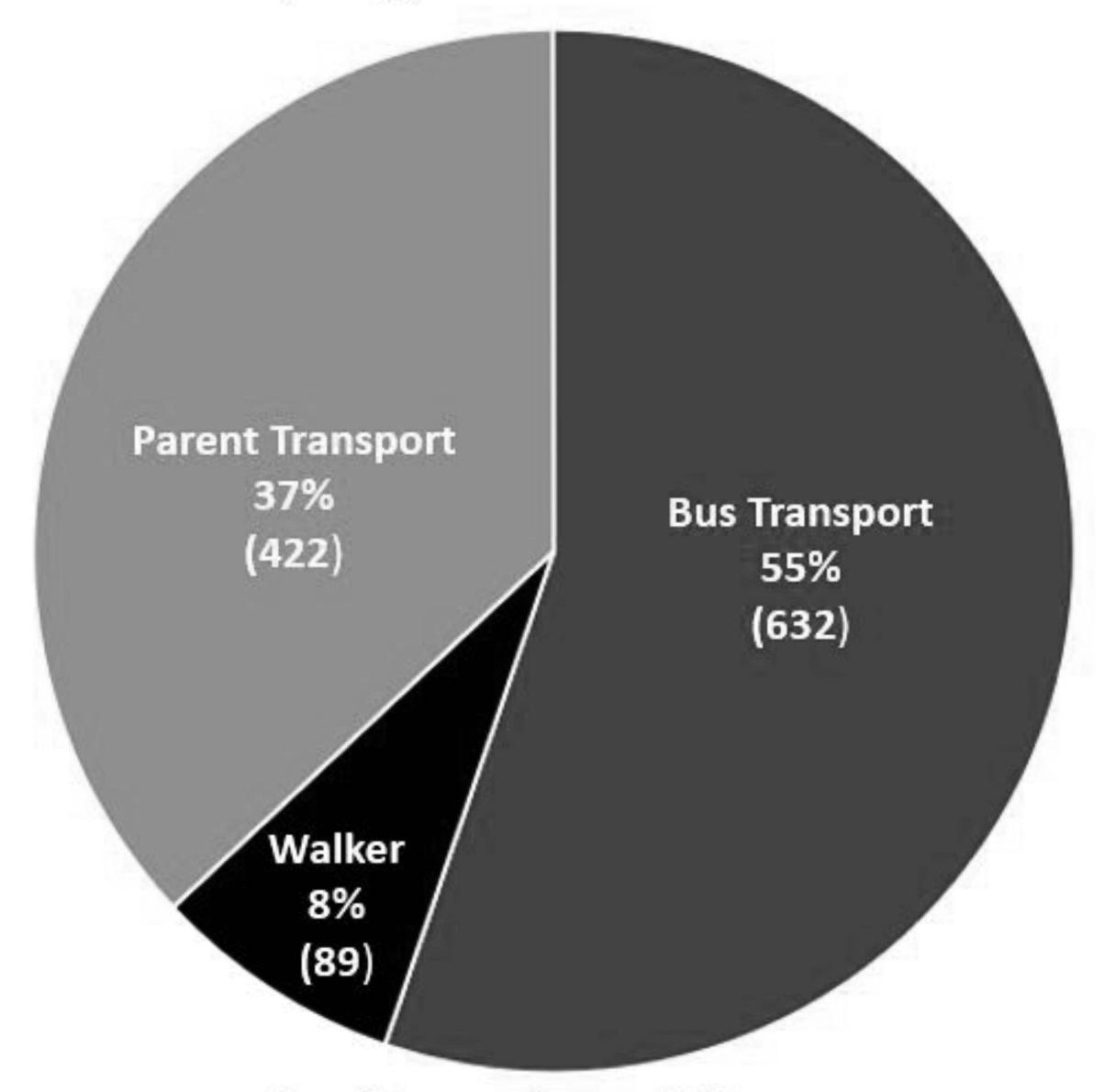

Plan Overview:

- Transition to 4 Days/Week of In-Person Instruction K-5
- Timeline: Begin Monday, 3/29 (if possible)
- K-5 sections will either be remote OR in-person. Teachers will no longer service in-person and remote students at the same time
- For now, Wednesdays will continue to be remote for all
- Some students will have to change teachers
- We are asking some teachers, including reading and math interventionists to teach fully remote sections
- We will be hiring two additional long-term substitutes to teach remote sections



Rationale:

- The goal was to provide the best possible education for the most students with as much consistency as possible.
- Stakeholder input (both teachers and parents) has clearly indicated that simultaneously teaching in-person and remote students is not optimal at K-5.
- Separating remote and in-person students, should enhance the quality of teaching and learning

Issues we have been working through:

- Issues in our student management system related to teacher-student linkages, scheduling, attendance, and report cards
- Rebuilding schedules including:
 - o Providing art, music, PE, and library to remote sections
 - Daily schedule for remote sections
 - Rebuilding schedules for special education, English as a New Language and other students support services
- Assigning remote sections to particular buildings, while still keeping some connection to the original home school
- Logistics including materials pickup & drop off
- Purchasing software & curricular materials for remote classes



Issues (cont.):

- Aligning curriculum across sections ensure continuity of learning for remote students
- Providing remote teachers with support as they learn new tech platforms & curriculum
- Executing a "warm handoff" of remote students to ensure relevant information is passed to the new teacher(s)
- Scheduling & planning science, social studies & morning meeting
- Ensuring that students still receive appropriate Academic Intervention Services
- Planning to provide education to in-person students in the event of quarantine/absence
- Anticipating an eventual return to 5 days/week



Secondary Updates



Continuation of 6-12 Hybrid Teaching

We are currently exploring a transition to 4 days/week of in-person instruction at the secondary level.

Classes will continue to mix remote and in-person students through June.



Secondary Parent Questionnaires

Parent questionnaires have been deployed for VHS and VMS. They close on Tuesday, 3/23. We will immediately begin analyzing the data and planning next steps.



Some Unique Logistical Challenges

- VMS Capital Project (down 5 classrooms)
- VHS Common Areas (esp. at arrival)



Supports Prior to the Transition

- VMS Math 8 Remediation After School
- VHS Wednesday Supports
- VHS Credit Recovery (69 students)
- Exploration of Early Return for Students w/ at least 2 of the following:
 - Individualized Education Plan (IEP)
 - 504 Plan
 - English as a New Language Services
 - Failing at Least 2 Courses
