Financial Aid Information

Financial Aid is a method of providing college students with scholarships, loans, part-time work, and grants to help with college living costs. Financial Aid can be used to pay for living expenses such as food, housing and transportation in addition to tuition costs.

Listed here are types of aid and ways to apply for them:

- The FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Aid) is now required for all financial aid applications. Will be available in December and will ask you to enter financial data from your 2022 taxes.
 Families will be directed to www.studentaid.gov to fill out this information.
- *TAP* is a New York State grant program. To apply for TAP, you must be a NYS resident applying to a school in NY and you must complete the FAFSA. The FAFSA confirmation page provides a link to apply for TAP.
- CSS Profile may be required depending on where the student is applying. Check the Admissions/Financial Aid website for each specific college regarding information on whether or not this is required. To get started with the Profile, go to www.collegeboard.org and click on CSS Profile.

Financial Aid is also available to pay for occupational education, such as vocational or trade programs. *To be eligible for aid, it is critical that students fill out the necessary forms accurately and within the given time frames.*

Colleges typically have early due dates for the Profile. There is a fee to register and complete the Profile, but fee waivers are available from the College Board.

Check the Financial Aid Offices where you are applying to see if they require any supplemental forms to be filled out.

IB and AP Exam Registration will take place in October. The fee for IB Exams is \$119 per exam. The fee for AP exams is \$98 per exam. Detailed registration information will be mailed home from the IB/Honors Office, but you should be aware that fees for both exams are due no later than November 1st.

Senior Meetings with your Counselor

The Vestal Scholar Certificate

Students who successfully complete six or more courses at the IB or AP level may be eligible to receive the Vestal Scholar Certificate upon graduation in June. Courses taken during any year of high school count and students do not need to have taken the associated exam in order to receive the Scholar Certificate credit. Students may check with their School Counselor or Mr. Dunham, IB/AP Coordinator to verify their candidacy.

LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION

Seniors, it is important for you to remember to include stamped, addressed envelopes with all paper requests for teacher recommendations. If you are requesting the recommendation online, be sure to doublecheck with the teacher to see that they received the request and know the deadline for submission.

APPLICATION DEADLINE

Due to the December recess, it is VERY important that your college applications be in the Counseling and Guidance Office no later than December 15, 2023. This will give counselors time to process and mail or upload all materials before the break. This is especially important for applications with due dates in early January. While we will do our best, we cannot guarantee that applications submitted after December 15 will be sent out before January 3, 2024.

SUNY BROOME – Save Some Money

Students who are applying to SUNY Broome should apply online on the SUNY Broome website at www.sunybroome.edu rather than applying through the SUNY system. There is no application fee if you apply directly to SUNY Broome. Please be sure to have your Social Security number handy.
