As a member of the Transportation Security Administration and a qualified FEMA Master Exercise Practitioner, Major Vince Bousa, retired USMC, serves as the Deputy Director of the Field Exercise Branch at the Transportation Security Operations Center in Virginia. Major Bousa is also an Assistant Incident Commander at that location.

Prior to joining the Transportation Security Administration in September of 2004, Major Bousa served for twenty-plus years on active duty in the U.S. Marine Corps, earning the rank of Major. Highlights of his Marine Corps career include serving as a DC-9 Aircraft Commander for the Commandant of the Marine Corps, a Helicopter Aircraft Commander with Marine Helicopter Squadron One serving the President of the United States, and as a White House Liaison Officer.

Major Bousa also participated in numerous military deployments to Europe and the Mediterranean and took part in combat operations and actions in Grenada, Beirut and Desert Storm.

He received a Bachelor of Science degree in Physical Science with a minor in Oceanography from the U.S. Naval Academy and completed professional military education courses at the Marine Corps Amphibious Warfare School and the Marine Corps Command and Staff College. He also earned an Associate's degree in Business Administration from the Beckley School of Technology, where he ranked first in his class.
