### **Use of School District Facilities**

Vestal Central School District is moving from paper forms to an online process for requesting use of District facilities. We are using the Master Library system to facilitate building-use requests.

Please visit our **Public Use of Facilities** page on the District website, found under the **District Info** drop-down menu (under **Resources**) or go to <u>www.vestal.</u> <u>stier.org/PublicUseofFacilities.aspx</u>, for more information. It has fees, plus guides and videos showing you how to register for an account, how to submit your use of facilities request, and more.

Procedures for the use of School Facilities are as follows:

• The School Board or Superintendent may waive facility-use fees for non-profit, tax-exempt Vestal youth organizations. Proof of non-profit, tax-exempt status must be submitted with the application for Use of School-District Facilities.\*

• All organizations will be responsible for the cost of damages to school property occasioned by its use.

• All facility-use requests must be approved by the Superintendent or designee prior to use, not just the building administrator.

• No organization may monopolize the use of a facility.

• Organizations may not reserve two locations, with one requested as a backup.

\*If an organization misuses school district property, its waiver of facility-use fees may be rescinded.

Measles/Mumps/Rubella (MMR)	2 doses
Varicella (Chickenpox)	2 doses



### Required Immunizations for Students entering Grades 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 & 11

### **Information on Physical Exam Requirements**

Health examinations are required for students who are:

- iii entering school for the first time (Pre-K or Kindergarten), and again in Grades 1, 3, 5, 7, 9 & 11.
- i referred by the Committee on Special Education.
- 🖗 need a work permit.
- i required by the NYS Commissioner of Education.

The physical exam must be recorded on the NYS Health Examination form. (This form is available online under <u>Physical</u> <u>Exam Requirements</u> on the Health Information & Forms web page of the District website.) In order to assist families, if you are unable to secure a health exam for your student with your Health Care Provider, the District will make arrangements with our school physician to provide a physical exam for your student during the 2023 - 24 school year.


# Class of 2023 Graduation (from cover)


